### Learning this week

In maths, we have continued our work on subtracting numbers with more than 4 digits, using the column method. If children wish to do more at home, they can create their own numbers using a dice. In English, we have finally finished writing 'Jetsam' which is our version of the story 'Flotsam'. We have thought really carefully about the vocabulary and added relative clauses, commas to clarify meaning and adverbials of time. Like all good writers, we have spent lots of time editing our work; checking for repetition and making sure we have written the best version we can.

In science, we researched the zoologist Jane Goodall who has spent her life studying chimpanzees. We then used PowerPoint to create 'websites' all about her including text, pictures and hyperlinks.

#### Homework

Just a reminder of our homework expectations: **daily reading** (this can be you reading to your child, or them reading to you – or a mixture of both) and at least 15 minutes of TT Rock Stars a week. Please encourage your child to focus on being accurate with their answers, rather than increasing the numbers of minutes they spend. The target is 500 correct answers every week.

Thank you for supporting your children with this - already we have seen an increase in accuracy!
