Learning this week

We have been learning about place value in numbers up to 1,000,000 and revising our knowledge of Roman Numerals. We have been using Gategno charts to help us make numbers 10, 100, 1000 bigger and smaller.

In English, we have started exploring a book called Flotsam; we learnt what the word flotsam means and made some predictions and inferences about the story. We enjoyed looking at some cameras similar to the one in the book and figuring out how they worked.

We have enjoyed getting to really know what the school looks like in Art. We have made sketches of the front of the school in preparation for our final project. We will be working towards creating a drawing of the school in a similar style to that of artist Ian Murphy.

To start our learning in history, we have created some timelines of main events and important people in Classical Ancient Greek times. We started to recognise that some of these may have influenced the way that we live today.
